Did you know that Churchill is the home of a small but powerful organisation providing direct and necessary help to those who need it in a brilliantly fast and efficient way. **Thrive OX7** is a charity set up and managed by a group of local women. The specific aims are to support children and families experiencing hardship in OX7. This can range from providing school uniform and shoes to paying for school trips, cots, bedding and multiple other small requests.

Occasionally we will purchase bigger items, should a family have arrived in the area with nothing.

This year we ran a food voucher scheme at the end of January for all families with children at primary school receiving free school meals, realising that for many families January is a long and difficult month. Requests are made through professionals working with the families such as midwives, health visitors, teachers and family support workers. **Thrive** relies on generous donations from local people and grants that we apply for.

What can you do to help? Just filling an old jam jar with loose change helps.

Jars labelled with the **Thrive** logo can be collected from the Living Room cinema in Chipping Norton and dropped back there when full.
